These programmes encourage civic participation, promote exchanges and joint projects, and support youth work and non-formal learning to combat social exclusion and discrimination. Youth-led actions are supported and extended globally through the Youth Action Plan in EU external action (2022-2027). The EU remains committed to addressing the challenges faced by young people, with a particular focus on mental health, education, employment, and housing affordability.

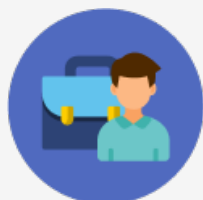
